Your ideas – discussion

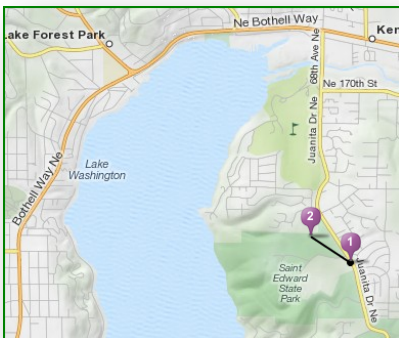
